### MORE THAN JUST A TOURIST ATTRACTION

Filippo the dolphin was a popular tourist attraction off the coast of Italy. Then, one day, something
happened to make the dolphin much more than just a tourist attraction. A 14-year-old teenager,
Davide Ceci, was sailing with his father on their boat when suddenly the boy fell into the water.
1 Davide did not know how to swim and was close to death when Filippo came to the rescue.
The dolphin managed to push the boy up out of the water to safety. He moved close enough to the
boat to enable Davide's father to grab him and pull him into the boat.
Davide's mother exclaimed "Filippo is a hero. It seems impossible an animal could have
done something like this – to save a human life." However, maritime researcher Dr Giovanna
Barbieri was not surprised that the dolphin had done this or that it didn't seem to fear humans at all.
The idea of dolphins rescuing humans is not new. Dolphins are known to be friendly to people. In
Greek stories and old sea stories, dolphins often came to the rescue. They also saved people from
sharks and acted as guides through dangerous waters. Dolphins not only help humans, but also
other dolphins from their family groups that have been injured. These animals assist newborn baby
dolphins too. 3
A different kind of rescue by dolphins was reported in 2003 by Hardy Jones, a wildlife filmmaker
and environmentalist. Jones was filming a group of dolphins when he noticed a huge shark coming
towards him. 4 Luckily, Jones was not only saved, but managed to record the rescue on
camera.
Similarly, in 2004, four people in New Zealand were saved from a great white shark. A group of
dolphins protected the four by swimming around them for 40 minutes until the shark lost interest
and swam away. Rob Howes, who had been swimming with his daughter and two of her friends,
explained that the dolphins had pushed all four of them together by swimming close circles around
them. Rob at first thought the dolphins were being playful. 5 It came as close as two metres
from Howes. The dolphins' action had saved the man and the girls.
In another case in the Red Sea, 12 divers who were lost for 13 hours were surrounded by dolphins
for the whole time. The dolphins kept away the many sharks that live in the area. 6 They
seemed to want to point out where the divers were.
